CREATING A POSITIVE LEGACY FROM THE PANDEMIC

Breaking the cycle of panic to neglect with an 'Always On' approach

While the COVID-19 pandemic led to immense suffering and loss of life, there are other pathogens that have the potential to cause even greater destruction. It remains a question of 'when' not 'if' the next pandemic will strike.

At this Summit we will set out an 'Always On' approach to preparing for the next pandemic: how can we develop global health architecture that can be used for routine healthcare delivery and respond to the next pandemic.

This requires developing capacities for digital infrastructure, surveillance, vaccination, and manufacturing technologies. It is aligned to three core principles:

- 1. Utility in peacetime and pandemics;
- Economic viability and sustainability; and
- 3. Ensuring equity and access

For this reason, we are convening experts from across disciplines in global health, and political leaders to:

- Refine what an 'Always On' approach could offer; and
- Outline clear 'Always On' missions, identify key stakeholders and levers for action.
