American Rhodes Scholars-elect for 2023

DISTRICT 1

Massachusetts

Tessa K.J. Haining, Newton, is a senior at Harvard College, where she is completing dual majors in Chemistry and Comparative Literature. She is an accomplished chemist who is also writing a senior thesis on twentieth-century French metaphysical philosopher Gilles Deleuze. Tessa is a varsity athlete on the heavyweight rowing team and a violinist and production manager for Harvard's student-run orchestra. As co-director of Harvard's Eating Concerns Hotline and Outreach service, she helped expand the program's reach on campus and also serves as a peer counselor. At Oxford, Tessa will do the M.Phil. in History of Science, Medicine, and Technology.

Massachusetts

Isaac A. Robinson, Milton, is a senior of Harvard College where he majors in Computer Science and Mathematics. He has done research or interned at N.I.H., Jane Street, Meta, and the Beijing Genomics Institute. He created and occupied the position of Director of Diversity, Inclusion and Ethical Technology at Technology for Social Good. Isaac is a varsity heavyweight rower, co-president of the Harvard College Democrats and has two patents pending. He will do the M.Sc. in Advanced Computer Science at Oxford.

DISTRICT 2

Connecticut

Margaret T. Williams, Greenwich, is a senior at the United States Military Academy where she majors in Economics. Margaret has won major awards in social sciences, economics and athletics, interned at the White House with the National Security Council, and is a research assistant at the Irregular Warfare Institute. She is a four-year varsity lacrosse player, and represented the United States at the Youth World Cup in soccer when she was 12. As an Army Engineer, she will conduct humanitarian aid in developing countries and following that hopes to help develop national security policy. At Oxford, Margaret plans to do the M.Sc. in Economics for Development.

New Jersey

At West Point, he was Regimental Commander for Cadet Basic Training and is now the Deputy Brigade Commander, while ranking 1st in his class. With deep interest and scholarship in Eastern Europe, she will do the M.Phil. in Modern European History at Oxford.
