Selfie video tips

- Keep the film under 1 minute.
- Record in PORTRAIT, not landscape!
- Film yourself in a well-lit area, e.g. in a garden or facing a window, and avoid background noise where possible.
- Prop your phone up to keep it stable, rather than holding it while recording.
- Keep your sentences short and contained.
- Say your words clearly, and smile!
