American Rhodes Scholars-elect for 2025

DISTRICT 1

Massachusetts

Kate E. Herndon, Newburyport, is a senior at the University of Alabama completing a double major in Criminal Justice and History. Her academic work examines the origin of laws defining and punishing domestic violence and the evolution of this legislation over the nineteenth and twentieth centuries. Kate is a committed domestic violence advocate and serves as the director of the student government's SAFE Center Committee. She is a recipient of the Obama-Chesky Scholarship for Public Service, is managing editor of a law and public policy journal and maintains a yoga practice. At Oxford, Kate will pursue the M.Sc. in Criminology and Criminal Justice.

Vermont

Lena R. Ashooh, Shelburne, is a student at Harvard University, where she designed and is pursuing Harvard's first major in Animal Studies, with research in philosophy, psychology,

biology, political science and other disciplines. She grew up exhibiting dairy cows as a member of her local 4-H club, and at Harvard has worked with land law examiners as an intern at the Bureau of Land Management, and lobbied legislators on environmental justice at the Center on Race, Poverty, and the Environment. Lena conducted field research on macaque monkeys in Puerto Rico, where she learned the faces and names of 150 individual monkeys while studying variation in facial behavior. She plays classical harp and has created a stop-motion animation film about the ethics of eating animals. At Oxford, she hopes to pursue a B.Phil. in Political Theory.

DISTRICT 2

New Jersey

Thomas Barone, Little Falls, is a student at Harvard University, where he is pursuing a B.A. in Social Studies. His academic work has contemplated intellectual history and political rhetoric, policy and decision-making. He has interned at the national politics desk of ABC News and serves as Editorial Chair of the Harvard Crimson, where he has won first place for editorial writing in the Society of Professional Journalists' Mark of Excellence awards for collegiate journalism. He hopes to pursue a career in journalism. At Oxford, he intends to study for an M.Phil. in History.

New Jersey

Gabriella M. Sorrentino, Monroe, is a senior at the United States Military Academy where she majors in both American History and Philosophy. Her research is highlighted in a forthcoming book: Henry O. Flipper, West Point's First Black Graduate: An Annotated Autobiography. At Oxford, she will pursue an M.Sc. in Migration Studies followed by a Master's in Public Policy.

Luiza Diniz Vilanova, New York, graduated from Columbia University in 2024 with a B.A in Political Science and Education. Born in the United States but raised in rural Brazil, she has founded multiple organizations supporting low-income Brazilian youth, including the

organization for which she currently serves as CEO, Tocando em Frente. Tocando em Frente has partnered with 24 Brazilian states to combat school dropout through community programming. Luiza is one of ten members of the UNICEF Youth International Council, where she has worked to advance global public health, and one of 23 winners of Brazil's Estudar Leaders Scholarship out of 46,000 total applicants. She enjoys running, roller skating, and Broadway musicals. At Oxford, she intends to pursue a Masters of Public Policy and an M.Sc. Education.

New York - South

Shepherd Y. Dzina, Tuxedo Park, is a student at the United States Military Academy, where he is pursuing a B.S. in economics. At the USMA, he is Brigade Executive Officer for the Corps of Cadets, serving as third in command of the Corps' 4,400 members, and editor of the West Point Journal of Politics and Security. Inspired by a childhood love of cooking, especially recipes based on his family's Taiwanese roots, he has pursued research into food insecurity in the armed forces and analyzed global poverty data for the U.S. International Development Finance Corporation. Shepherd is a member of the nationally-ranked West Point curling team and the West Point bowling team. At Oxford, he hopes to complete an M.Phil. in Development Studies and pursue a career fostering peace and security through international development and cooperation.
