I want to start by saying thank you. This 2014-2015 financial year saw a terrific increase in annual giving participation which reached 27.9%, compared to 17.7% the previous year. Our cumulative participation since the start of the campaign is now at 42.4%. Having a high participation rate is crucial for the success of our campaign to secure the Scholarships, and also greatly assists in raising support from those outside the Scholar community, and from Foundations, as it demonstrates the commitment and support of the Rhodes community around the world.

Development Update

Thank you to all our generous donors, supporters, volunteers and staff.

WITH £46M LEFT TO RAISE, we remain confident of success with the *Campaign for the Second Century* and securing the 83 core Scholarships. We would not be where we are without you. Thank you.

The volume of senior Scholar engagement in the past 12 months has been valuable to the Trust, with the Warden criss-crossing the globe to talk with Scholars at alumni events in cities including Vancouver, Sydney, Singapore, Cape Town and Delhi, as well as hosting over two hundred senior Scholars back at Rhodes House.

Scholars have coordinated roundtables and conferences covering themes including socio-economic inequality (San Francisco), financial reform (New York), Ebola (Oxford) and Africa and Asia higher education (Oxford). Convenings are coming up soon on topics including biomedicine and climate change.

The Rhodes Scholar Network has enabled Scholars across different geographies and classes to find each other and discuss important issues online and, subsequently, face to face. With the addition of the mentor match function, the online network is proving a useful tool for all Scholars. If you have not yet signed up, please do.




Participation in fundraising in 2014/15 is more than 50% up compared with 2013/14. Thank you to everyone who has given this year and to the tireless Class Leaders who helped so much with our annual giving push during May and June. We achieved 28% Scholar annual participation rate compared with 18% in the previous year and, again, the Going Down class achieved a remarkable 100%. In the 'boat race of countries', the United States just pipped Germany to the post. Every donation counts and this year there were 1,318 gifts from Scholars.

In the year ahead, you should experience a similar pattern of fundraising activity to the year just gone with a Scholar Calling programme in November and December and a Class Leader-led annual giving push, again using a dedicated annual giving website, in May and June.

We remain very grateful for the support that the Development team at Rhodes House receives from the Scholar community. In addition to the guidance and networking from the Development Committee and Trustees, Scholars make introductions to other supporters, encourage their classmates and share





Annual Giving

In the past year, Rhodes Scholars have responded wonderfully to our focus on annual giving.

BY MAKING A GIFT every year, of whatever size, Scholars helps the Trust in multiple ways. Gifts of all sizes make a difference. For example, a gift of £300 covers one week of stipend for a current Scholar allowing them to focus solely on their studies.

Annual gifts are directed only to the core Scholarships which are the focus of the *Campaign for the Second Century*. Not only does your support allow the endowment to grow and recover faster, but a high participation by Rhodes Scholars is also critical to persuading foundations and philanthropists who are not Scholars to support the campaign.

Participation increased to 28% for the financial year 2014-15, which is up by a phenomenal 55% compared to the previous year. This is a very significant leap in a 12 month period and we are grateful for all your enthusiasm and support. Over 1,300 Scholars made a gift this year, the result of a huge joint effort across the generations. Only gifts from Rhodes Scholars can raise our participation rate but many Scholars also played a dual role as enthusiastic fundraisers too!

During the first 'Scholar Calling' programme in December 2014, a team of 20 current Scholars from eight different countries spoke to nearly 400 senior Scholars mainly in the USA, Canada and the UK. Feedback from Scholars on both ends of the phone line was very positive, and the conversations flowed freely.

As the closing date for annual gifts approached on 30 June, a special campaign was launched to boost participation. During May and June 2015 over 100 Class Leaders across almost all Class Years were in touch with classmates to encourage them to make a gift. Scholars Going Down got involved too. A gift was announced at the annual Going Down Dinner and once again a wonderful 100% of the class contributed.














The two hundred and one Scholars currently on stipend are spread across thirty four colleges of the University and involved in every facet of Oxford life...

...Activities range from the charitable and pro bono, to college officer positions, international competitions, poetry and novel writing, dance, drama and much, much more. Over the tenure of the current cohort, Scholars have achieved Blues and Half Blues in a wide range of sports – with Rhodes swimmers and women's cricketers having significant victories this year. Rhodes Scholars have established many interest groupings which meet actively through the year, at the latest count there are around 20 different discussion and activity groups. Recently formed societies include the Rhodes Climate Group, the Rhodes Asia Group and Redress Rhodes. On the creative front, the Rhodes Create group themed many events over Trinity Term, including opportunities for live drama, dance, community art, and poetry.

Academically, Scholars are spread across forty six departments and faculties of all four academic divisions in Oxford. They are engaged in postgraduate taught courses (60%), and research degrees (38%). Three Scholars are pursuing second undergraduate degrees and one Scholar is taking a Rhodes Service Year to develop an early childhood education social enterprise. Scholars in the Medical Sciences are conducting research in areas such as Ebola, Autism, Parkinson's, Alzheimer's and Diabetes, the inequality of healthcare delivery in South Africa and the improvement of refugee healthcare in humanitarian and conflict settings. Astrophysicists are looking at the accelerated expansion of the universe, and oceanic and atmospheric physicists

are looking at the influence of the ocean currents and of the stratosphere on climate systems. Rhodes engineers are working on projects as varied as the use of statistical models to interpret barely perceptible signs of impending illness and navigation systems for autonomous cars. Rhodes anthropologists are living with remote tribes in Kenya, logging communities in New Brunswick and retirement communities in California. Space does not permit examples of Scholars in Law, Theology, Politics, International Development, Philosophy and much, much more. Of the results out so far, over half of Rhodes Scholars achieved Distinction in their taught courses and the four PPE'ists churned out three Firsts and a 2:1.

Within the context of the wider University, Rhodes Scholars have been instrumental in forming the *Good Lad Workshop* (promoting positive masculinity), in supporting the campaigns *It Happens Here* (making Oxford a place safe from sexual violence), *It Gets Brighter* (to de-stigmatise mental illness) and *CRAE* (Campaign for Racial Awareness and Equality) amongst others.

The Scholars in Oxford are often at Rhodes House, for meetings of the Scholar societies, for the popular Meet & Mingle evenings, and for a wide range of visiting speakers, many of them returning senior Scholars. One of the highlights of the 2014-15 academic year was the introduction of two three-day Retreats for Scholars – on Service & Leadership for first year Scholars and on Building a Good Life: Meaning, Balance and Passion for second year Scholars. The Retreats, led by Warden, Charles Conn, with the help of senior Scholar moderators, took the form of structured conversations amongst peers, based on a wide range of readings, rather than a taught programme. Both Retreats were an outgrowth of conversations with many Scholars past and present, and provided Scholars with the opportunity to talk together about what these ideas mean. We are looking forward to this year's Retreats at beginning and end of Hilary Term.

The Class of '15 has arrived in Oxford to a terrific programme of welcome activities arranged by current Scholars. We are all enjoying getting to know them.

Finance and Investment Report

ENDOWMENT STATUS

THE RHODES SCHOLARSHIPS are funded through payout from Endowment and expendable funds received through annual giving. As of 30 June, 2015, Endowment Assets totalled £187.4 million, an increase of approximately £31.5 million from 30 June, 2014, due to a combination of the response to the *Campaign for the Second Century* and strong investment returns.

The endowment investment portfolio is overseen by the Rhodes Trust Finance and Investment Committee which is comprised of Trustees and other senior investment professionals. The Committee reviews investment strategy, asset allocation, performance, liquidity and risk, quarterly, or more frequently as required. As of 30 June, 2015, 83% of the Trust's assets are managed by Oxford University Endowment Management (OUEM) in a globally diversified, strategic asset allocation based portfolio. OUEM was founded by Oxford University, with input from the Rhodes Trust, in 2007 to create a unitised endowment portfolio managed full time by OUEM professionals with appropriate fiduciary oversight. The investment process and governance of OUEM are based on the best practices of top global endowments and foundations. Rhodes Trustees believe the OUEM investment portfolio and programme are well suited to the Trust's long term investment objectives. A Rhodes Trustee is currently a member of the Investment Committee of OUEM. OUEM pays an annual dividend of approximately 4%.

The remaining 17% of the Trust's assets consist of legacy illiquid assets, primarily Private Equity, and additional liquid assets sufficient to cover the Trust's expenses in excess of the OUEM dividend. The legacy illiquid assets are managed by the Committee with the expectation that they will be invested with OUEM once realised.

It is the policy of the Committee to transfer to OUEM new gifts to the permanent endowment at the next available investment opportunity, usually within six months. During the year ended 30 June, 2015, the Trust transferred £32.3 million of donations and realisations of legacy assets to OUEM, and received a dividend of £4.6 million.

INVESTMENT PERFORMANCE






Fig. 2. COMBINED ASSET ALLOCATION, LIQUIDITY AND OTHER EXPOSURES

OUEM PERFORMANCE for the year ended 30 June, 2015 was 12.6%, comparing favourably to the MSCI World return of 10.3%, and other endowment returns. Longer term, OUEM has consistently returned CPI + 5%, a key benchmark for preserving the purchasing power of perpetual capital while minimising the risk of permanent capital loss. *Fig. 1* outlines OUEM performance. *Fig. 2* provides the Trust's combined asset allocation, liquidity and other exposures.

Fig. 1. OUEM PERFORMANCE






SCHOLAR COSTS, ENDOWMENT AND CAPITAL CAMPAIGN

THE TRUST SPENT £11.8 million in the year ended 30 June, 2015. Spending was funded by the OUEM dividend of £4.6 mllion, £4.9 million from other liquid assets and £2.3 million in expendable fund donations. Approximately 73% of expenses were related to direct Scholar costs defined as University fees, stipends, travel, medical, and the Service & Leadership Programme. The Committee reviews the annual budget of the Trust and recommends it to the full Board of Trustees for approval. *Fig.* 3 gives a detailed breakdown of Trust expenses aggregated on a per Scholar basis.

Though the number varies, on average there are 220 Scholars in residence in Oxford. The Trust currently awards 83 Scholarships annually (the Core), and Scholars stay in residence for approximately 2.8 years to complete their programs of study. After fully allocating all expenses, the Trust spends approximately £54,000 per Scholar per year. These expenses have doubled over the past ten years primarily as a result of increases in University fees and living expenses during a time of decreased UK government subsidies to Universities. *Fig. 4* (opposite page) demonstrates the doubling of operating expenses since 2007.



The goal of the Trust is to fully endow all Scholarships in perpetuity. As opposed to major Universities which typically derive 20% to 30% of annual expenses from the endowment payout, the Trust is financed entirely by payout from endowment and gifts. Annual gifts to the Trust have been highly variable. As a result, the Committee has recommended to the Trust that over time it adopt an endowment spending rate of no more than

4%-5%, subject to a smoothing formula designed to eliminate the impact of excessively high or low investment returns. At this spending rate, a total endowment of approximately £250 million to £300 million is required to fully fund the Core.

In September 2013, the Trust announced a £150 million *Campaign for the Second Century* to achieve full funding of the Core. To date, the Campaign has realized £65 million in funds received. Pledges outstanding, a substantial portion of which are subject to matching gifts, total £39 million. *Fig. 5* summarises progress to date in the Campaign.

A separate entity, the Rhodes Trust Horizon Fund, has been established to fund Scholarships from all new jurisdictions. The policy of the Trust is to fully fund all new Scholarships at inception, apart from the Core. To date the Trust has announced new Scholarships from China and the United Arab Emirates. In September 2014, the first two Scholars from the United Arab Emirates matriculated at Oxford. Currently Chinese Scholars are scheduled to arrive in Oxford in September 2016.

The year ending June 30, 2015 was an excellent financial year for the Trust. Endowment value increased substantially, investment returns were excellent on an absolute and relative basis, and investments made by the Trust in Development capability led to record gifts to the Trust, and record participation rates by Rhodes Scholars. Additionally, the Trust has adopted a disciplined budget process and is on the way to achieving the goals of its longer term strategic plan. There is still much work to be done to make the Trust sustainable, with the top priority being to raise the additional £46 million of funds necessary to fund the Trust in perpetuity.


YOU CAN HELP to secure the core Scholarships by making a legacy or planned gift commitment. Planned gifts, and the intention to leave a gift in your will, are now eligible for a new Legacy Match meaning there has never been a better time to make this commitment.

The Rhodes Scholarships came into existence from a bequest. Over 100 years later it remains true that a bequest or planned gift to the Rhodes endowment is one of the most impactful ways you can support future Scholars in perpetuity.

Donations and pledges from bequests and planned gifts are making a significant contribution to the overall success of the Campaign to secure the core scholarships. With your commitment, funds given in this way will over time form a growing proportion of the Rhodes endowment, helping to secure forever the core Scholarships and enhancing the Scholar experience.

Apart from bequests in your will there are many other types of planned giving, including gifts of life insurance policies, real estate, personal property, or placing assets in trust with the Rhodes Trust named as a beneficiary. With some planned gifts you can continue to receive income from an asset during your lifetime. Your tax bill can also be reduced, for example by gifting assets such as securities which have risen in value, or by lowering estate tax liability.

Many Rhodes Scholars and others have let the Trust know of their intention to make a gift in their will or another form of financial planning during their lifetime. 


CHISANGA PUTA-CHEKWE




