DISTRICT 1

Rhode Island

Yael S. Goldstein, Barrington, is a senior at Harvard University completing a major in Philosophy. Yael's senior thesis examines philosophical justifications for a right to housing, and she has worked extensively on housing issues while an undergraduate, including as a guest services director and case manager at the Harvard Square Homeless Shelter. Yael is an accomplished musician who performs oboe and English horn with the Harvard Bach Society Orchestra. She also volunteers as a classical music host for Harvard's student radio station. At Oxford, Yael intends to pursue the B.Phil. in Philosophy.

Rhode Island

Nicholas G. Sanzi, Providence, graduated Phi Beta Kappa from Brown University in May of 2025 with a B.Sc. in International and Public Affairs. He was the Managing Editor for the Brown Journal of World Affairs and is currently a legislative intern with Rhode Island Senator Sheldon Whitehouse. Nicholas paints portraiture and has filmed multiple funded video journalism projects, including a documentary on graffiti artists in France and a short film about an Afghan refugee in Providence, R.I. He is a triathlete. At Oxford, he intends to read for the M.Phil. in Politics.

Connecticut

Sophia J. Wang, Woodbridge, received a B.S. in Aeronautics and Astronautics Engineering from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT) in 2024. Sophia currently works in the country of Bhutan, leading a sustainability policy taskforce.
